Summary of most important observations, positive as well as negative, regarding implementation and effectiveness of the Forest Management System:	Operations within the DFA are minimal for the audit period owing to the mature age class structure of the Bunbury Treefarm Project (BTP) plantations, which are approaching clearfell age for short rotation fibre plantations. The condition of plantations inspected and management of harvesting operations was noted to be very good and staff and contractors were clearly very competent. The audit highlighted several minor non-conformities around trademark applications, public disclosures, performance standards for soil and water management, response to illegal activities and the group scheme. The gap analysis to AS4708-2021 identified a number of opportunities for improvement regarding chain of custody dockets, information provision to lessors and the group scheme.

Unresolved issues (if identified):	The BTP plantations were established under the BTP Agreement Act 1995, which sunsets in 2030. The group member is currently determining future management of the plantations within the DFA following harvests which will be completed prior to the sunset date. How the longer term commitment to forest management in this DFA will be maintained is yet to be resolved. See finding 2022.11
